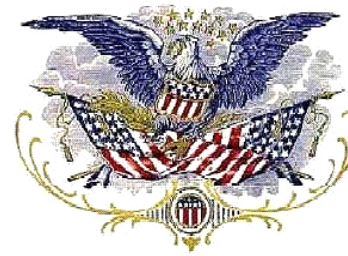

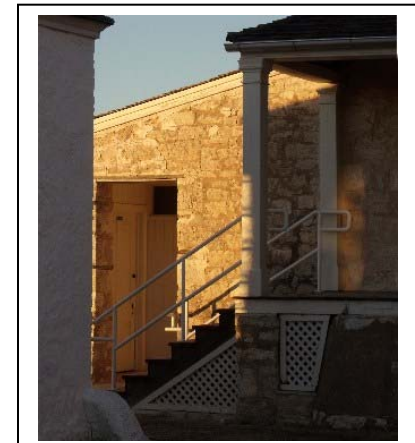


New Railing for the Hospital Steps

The Texas Public Utilities Commission has written the final order for the new 345KV transmission line from McCamey D substation to Kendall. It will pass several miles south of Fort McKavett and will not interfere with the fort's view shed.

Legislative Update



By now, most people have seen the news about the cuts in the Texas Historical Commission's budget. Some things to keep in mind:

- 1) HB-1, the State Budget, has just been filed. This will be one of the first bills to be introduced and one of the last to be approved. A lot of changes will take place before it becomes law.
- 2) It looks like most of the budget cuts will take place in programs such as the Main Street, Courthouses, and Heritage Trails programs. Historic Sites cuts are much less drastic.
- 3) Through THC's fiscal year 2011 things will be pretty much "business as usual" except for some "belt tightening" that was already scheduled.

We know everyone is worried about the final outcome, so we will keep everyone updated as things happen with the Legislature.

In the meanwhile, you will want to contact your House Representatives and Senators and tell them you understand the need for cuts, but you want them to be fair and not to the point of destroying needed programs. Now is the time to get your voice heard!

POTATO PIE.

(Sufficient for 22 men.)

16½ pounds meat.

20 pounds potatoes.

½ ounce pepper.

1 pound onions.

3 ounces salt.

Cut up and stew the onions with jelly from the meat added; boil or steam the potatoes, and mash them; grease the inside of a baking dish; line the sides with a portion of the mashed potatoes; place the meat and cooked onions in the center; season with pepper and salt; cover over with the remainder of the mashed potatoes, and bake till the potato cover is brown. As the mashed potatoes absorb the moisture of the meat and render it dry, about two pints of gravy prepared from the liquor in which the onions were cooked should be poured into the pie after it is taken out of the oven.

GRAVY FOR BAKED MEATS.

Having removed the joint, put the pan on the fire, remove the floating grease and save it as dripping; pour into the pan from a half pint to a pint or more of boiling water. Mix well; then stir into the mixture quickly two or more tablespoonfuls of blended browned flour; boil up once; season with pepper and salt, and serve. If the gravy is preferred with the grease in it omit the skimming.
